

TREES FOR TROT



It has been 18 months since the completion of TROT's covered arena. This giant 15,600 square foot building provides so much shade, water and pride in our property.

After some early discussions and plans that fell on the back-burner plans, Margaux DeConcini, TROT's Development Director, pulled volunteer, Jack Huss aside on a whim. Jack is a retired landscape architect who has already decorated TROT with his talents. Margaux said jokingly, "Jack, wouldn't it be neat if we had a beautiful, landscaped garden around the covered arena?" No more than two weeks later, Jack came into the office with a large roll of

white papers under his arm. He spread the papers on the office conference table, and everyone in the office was in shock and awe at the sight of detailed architectural drawings of the proposed garden around the covered arena! "We had never seen anything so perfect," said Margaux. The original idea which was more like a fantasy of having a garden surround the covered arena suddenly started to become a reality!

After a couple meetings, the TROT team created the garden campaign called Trees for TROT. The campaign's goal was to obtain all the trees, cactus and shrubs needed for the garden, but we still needed other assistance for this massive undertaking. TROT is incredibly fortunate to have many long-time organization connections in the community, and the opportunity for new partnerships makes us giddy.













With the Trees for TROT campaign underway, we found this to be a perfect time to increase our community ties by partnering with Andrada Polytechnic High School SPED Program, a part of the Vail Unified School District. "We aim to create a more diverse and dynamic learning environment that expand our students' learning experiences beyond the confines of the classroom" says Alvin Albasco, Education teacher Andrada Special at Polytechnic School. High "Our recent collaboration with TROT has proven to be a valuable avenue for promoting community involvement and fostering a sense of accomplishment among our students". Through our partnership with TROT, we are creating a dynamic and diverse learning environment that provides our students with opportunities to their skills, and expand simultaneously promoting a sense of community involvement and social responsibility. The participating Andrada students have developed a strong sense of pride and excitement about their and enthusiastically recount experiences to staff members, as they eagerly anticipate future visits.

Since January 2023, the students from Andrada Polytechnic High School have worked twelve to sixteen hours a week alongside TROT volunteers, including our landscape architect. They prepared the area for planting, laid the plan, and installed the infrastructure for TROT's amazing garden. So far, with Jack's instruction and leadership, the students have sorted and placed 22 tons of rip rap for the water retention basins; flagged locations for all 150 plants specified in the landscape plan; laid 800 feet of underground irrigation line; connected 150 water emitters to 600 feet of drip line; and have dug more than half of the holes needed for the plants. The students have learned how to use all of the gardening tools, how to look at the landscape plans to figure out where plants are supposed to be placed. "My favorite part of this project is the student interaction" said Jack Huss, TROT volunteer and landscape architect. "It is true inspiration to see these students show up and work hard; they have never missed a day!"

The Trees for TROT garden project is expected to be 100% completed by May 2023, but there is still plenty of work to be done between now and then. However, completion is in sight. We are grateful for all of those who have given their time, in-kind gifts, and monetary assistance to support this dream project. Dora Brown, Program Director:

A new adult participant in the Back In the Saddle (BITS) adaptive riding program has delighted me with her talent! This long-time equestrian had many years away from the saddle after a serious motor vehicle accident and was looking for a way to get back in the presence of an equine partner. Within one semester, she does not require any holds; she is posting her trot off lead; and is learning to bend and supple her horse. It is amazing how muscle memory can be positively influenced by being Back In The Saddle!





Melissa Radtke, CTRI:

One of the participants in my school-age class began riding last semester. Initially, he came to TROT a bit anxious and worried about riding horses. He quickly progressed from riding our steady Dixie to riding the more energetic Prince Julian and he gained confidence every week. His balance and coordination improved to the point that he can now perform trot transitions with only 1 side-walker offering support. This participant recently accomplished the incredible feat of attempting a trot transition all the way around the arena! I am so impressed with his growing confidence and willingness to try and refine new riding skills! As an instructor, it is so exciting for me to see participants progress in riding skills and at the same time gain strength, coordination and confidence.

Rachel Radtke, CTRI:

A participant in one of my adult classes has been riding for a little over a year now. She loves riding Fiesta and looks forward to riding him each week. She has learned to direct Fiesta with minimal assistance from her horse handler, and she has built up the strength to hold the two-point position for longer periods of time. What really makes her light up though, is learning new skills. She has recently learned to back up Fiesta and to complete a trot transition. She beams with excitement every time she gets to trot! Seeing the delight on her face and getting to celebrate with her when she learns new skills brings so much joy to me each week.

Coco Hames, CTRI:

I was so proud of L's work on emotional regulation and impulse control in class a few weeks ago. he can get excited and have a hard time controlling his body, but we worked out a plan, and he talked through his physical impulses. I was so thrilled and proud of him when he made good decisions and, more importantly, he was proud of himself! I knew how hard he had to try to do the right thing, and we high fived and celebrated. Now he mentioned his good choices, and realizes that he can take a deep breath and think about what he is doing choosing self control.

Tara Leingang, CTRI:

"My recent "mission moment" has been witnessing friendships developing among my riders. On Tuesday afternoon, I teach a group of elementary age students who have difficulty making friends in "the real world". At TROT, it's different. They began by shyly greeting each other in our warmup leapfrog game. Now, I sometimes have to call them over to mount because they are having so much fun playing together before class! That's what it's all about! TROT helps them feel comfortable being silly, normal kids, in a way that is not always understood in other parts of their lives.

I found TROT over ten years ago. I had finished homeschooling both of my sons and know I needed to find something to do with my time. My first visit to TROT happened to be on a day when the veterans rode. Watching the transformation of people who moved with physical limitations to riders on horseback who moved without limitations touched my heart in ways that I had not experienced before. One of my first assignments was with children from the Arizona School of the Deaf and Blind. I watched children who could not see call out to their horses as they were led to them. With joy they mounted and rode with confidence. Again my heart was impacted in ways that I did not expect.

My main equine partner for most of my time here has been Carmela. She keeps me on my toes. She is often sassy at the hitching post and will find the smallest patch of grass to try to eat on the way to the arena, but I love working with her.

I am also one of the TROT gardeners. As a desert dweller for over 40 years, I rejoice when it rains. However, I know that while the TROT gardens flourish after the rain, the weeds flourish as well! If you see a weed, you are welcome to pull it along with others around it!

While I have seen many changes over the years, the heart of TROT has remained consistent.

We truly do change lives one stride at a time!


