However, as I turned my head to look towards the uncovered arena, all I saw was a gigantic cloud of dust. The galloping sounds got even stronger, and

Rachael Radtke - Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor

Rachael grew up in the Tucson area and first discovered TROT while in high school. After taking a break to complete a degree in Piano Performance at the University of Arizona and to focus on her career as a piano teacher, she returned to TROT. Rachael began volunteering in August of 2020, allowing her to hone her skills as a horse handler. Then in June 2022, she was able to fulfill her dream of becoming a Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor through PATH Intl. In her spare time, Rachael enjoys a variety of activities including: gardening, spending time with family, and taking hunter/jumper lessons.

Coco Hames - Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor

A native of central Florida, Coco Hames grew up around horses, learning to ride in both English and Western disciplines. After more than a decade touring the world as a musician, she rediscovered her passion for horsemanship while volunteering at Southern Reins Center for Equine Therapy in the Memphis, Tennessee area. Upon relocating to Arizona in 2021, Coco started volunteering at TROT and became a Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor through PATH Intl. in 2022.

A graduate of the University of Florida with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English, Coco has a Montessori teaching certification and has previously worked developing programming for the Children's Museum of Memphis. She also founded *Tennessee Hollow*, a non-profit animal rescue based in Nashville. Coco lives in Oro Valley with her husband and her Bichon Frise, Jojo, and keeps her registered APHA gelding, Tuco, nearby.



Have you heard about Prince Julian yet?

Julian is a 12-year-old Morgan cross gelding. When he arrived at TROT, he didn't seem to know why all the humans wanted to be around him so much, but he quickly realized that when he approached all these people, he was loved on, pampered, and taken out to grass fields. From the beginning, *Julian* excelled at equine-assisted counseling sessions with his partner, *Raven*. *Julian* quickly became a program staff favorite. After intensive groundwork, he progressed to the mounted training program and has now made his debut in Adaptive Riding. *Julian* is managing very well in his new role as an equine partner for therapeutic riding. His smooth walk and trot gaits have been an amazing addition to our program for riders learning to trot or riders that require less input and pelvic movement. His forwardness has also assisted our more independent riders in building core strength, sitting up tall in the saddle, and regulating their posting trot. We are beaming with pride over *Julian*, and we can't wait to see how his future as a TROT horse evolves over time.



Rider Spotlights



This semester, NE started participating in adaptive riding classes at TROT. After just a few classes, he has shown incredible progress in several riding skills, including mounting and dismounting confidently and increasing his limited vocabulary. One of his big achievements is learning to say the verbal cue "walk-on"! Even though he has only been riding for a few weeks, NE now consistently uses the verbal cue "walk-on" to ask his equine partner, *Carmela*, to walk forward! One of NE's favorite class activities is playing a game of basketball which provides great opportunities for him to work on coordination, sequencing, and showing off his newly learned riding skill--walk-halt-walk transitions! NE shows up for class every week with a smile on his face and is eager to work on riding skills and participate in activities!



When YP first started at TROT, he could not stay on the horse for more than a few minutes before attempting to dismount. He would experience meltdowns, and he often had a hard time completing the lesson. Gradually, he began to be able to ride for longer stretches, getting more comfortable, and self-regulating through the uncomfortable moments with support from his instructor and team. This semester, he is much more comfortable and confident, and just yesterday he had a breakthrough that had us all cheering and him beaming with a big smile on his face. YP was not only able to complete his entire lesson, sit quietly and balanced in his saddle, but also learned a new skill called two-point! He placed his weight in his stirrups, supported himself on his equine partner *Carmela*, and lifted himself out of his saddle.

TROT continues to be a leader in innovative equine-assisted activities by maintaining the distinguished title of **Premier Accredited Center** by PATH (Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship), International. This distinction is highly respected, as only 15% of PATH's 850+ accredited centers globally have achieved this level of accreditation.

What does it mean when we say this?

It means TROT is held to the highest standards. Every year, TROT reviews over 300 industry standards to verify we are exceeding all criteria needed to maintain our status. These standards include: safety, equine management, mental health training, adaptability and inclusion for those living with disabilities. The standards ensure that all programs are using current research and evidence-based models.

The entire operation (programs, property, and administration) undergoes a thorough audit every five years to ensure that all of the required standards are met. ALL of TROT's instructors are professionally trained and certified through PATH



and are required to complete a minimum of 25 continuing education hours annually on a variety of topics including but not limited to: disability and mental health education, equine welfare, and advanced horsemanship training. The list goes on about what it means to be a PATH Premier Accredited Center.

All of us at TROT are very proud of our status, and we are recognized nationally for our programs.

TROT is proud to be the only PATH Premier Accredited Center in the Greater Tucson area.

Creating Connection

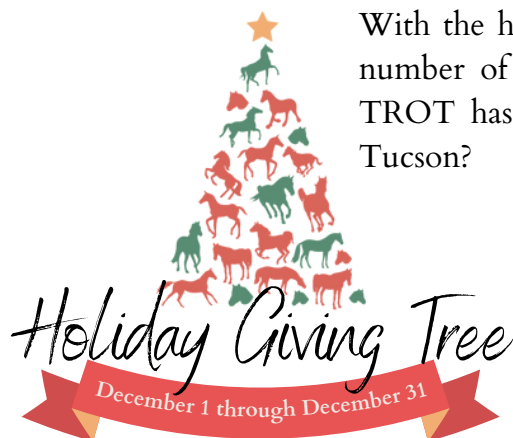
Creating Connection from the Group Up A teen group facilitated by Sierra Ohrel, LPC

As part of TROT's equine-assisted counseling program, a group of teenage girls met for four weeks on Fridays after school for equine-related activities and fun. Since loss of connection has contributed to teen mental health problems, TROT decided to offer a group for teens where they could get to know each other and the TROT horses. The group was named *Creating Connection from the Ground Up*. Some of the areas that were explored included: present-moment awareness, becoming grounded, and being seen and heard. This included activities with some of TROT's equine partners to help support connection – both internally and externally.

On a rainy September evening, a group of six teenage girls met for the first time in the covered arena at TROT. A circle was formed with barrels and benches to sit on. Group agreements were shared as a foundation of their time together. A safe space to be vulnerable and present was created. The group met the horses by noticing when the horses noticed them. The girls were able to identify when connection was made long before there was physical contact with the horses, as they learned about non-verbal communication both with the horses and with each other.

On the second week, trust was created with a leading exercise and a blind trust walk. Communication and empathy were built upon. Then a partner leading exercise was done with the horses. This utilized the herd philosophy of teens by not having to do something alone. An invisible lead line exercise was done with the horses to show the participants how being the leader and modulating your energy affected the horses.

The last session ended with another rainy night of self-expression – creating small paintings for self and others. There was laughter, kindness, and connection. With the help of the horses, the participants started as a group of strangers and went on to build enduring friendships by the end of their time together at TROT!
